As Year 3 pupils, you need to read aloud at least 3 times a week to an adult at home and have it recorded in your reading diary.



You also need to learn and practise your 2x, 10x, 5x, 3x, 4x and 8x table facts.

Maybe the fight between the Space-bat-angel-dragon and the Iron Man? Or when he fell off the cliff right at the beginning.
