- Writing labels and captions and simple sentences using sounds represented correctly in sequence

- Counting to 10, then 20 and beyond
- Counting in 2's 5's 10's
- number rhymes
- comparing small numbers and placing on a number track
- 1 more/1 less
- Subtraction / taking away
- Add two groups of objects to find the total.
- Find the total number of items in 2 groups by adding them altogether.
- Count reliably with numbers 1-20.
- Begin to use the language associated with addition and subtraction.
- Patterns
- 2D and 3D shapes
- Use language associated with time, money and shape.
