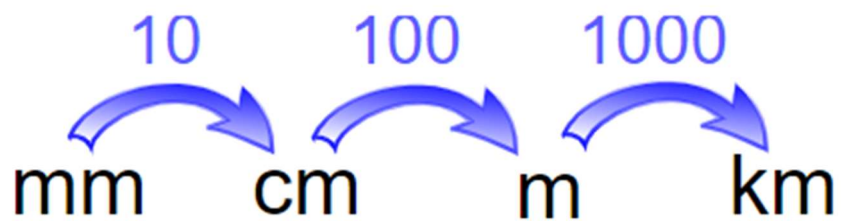
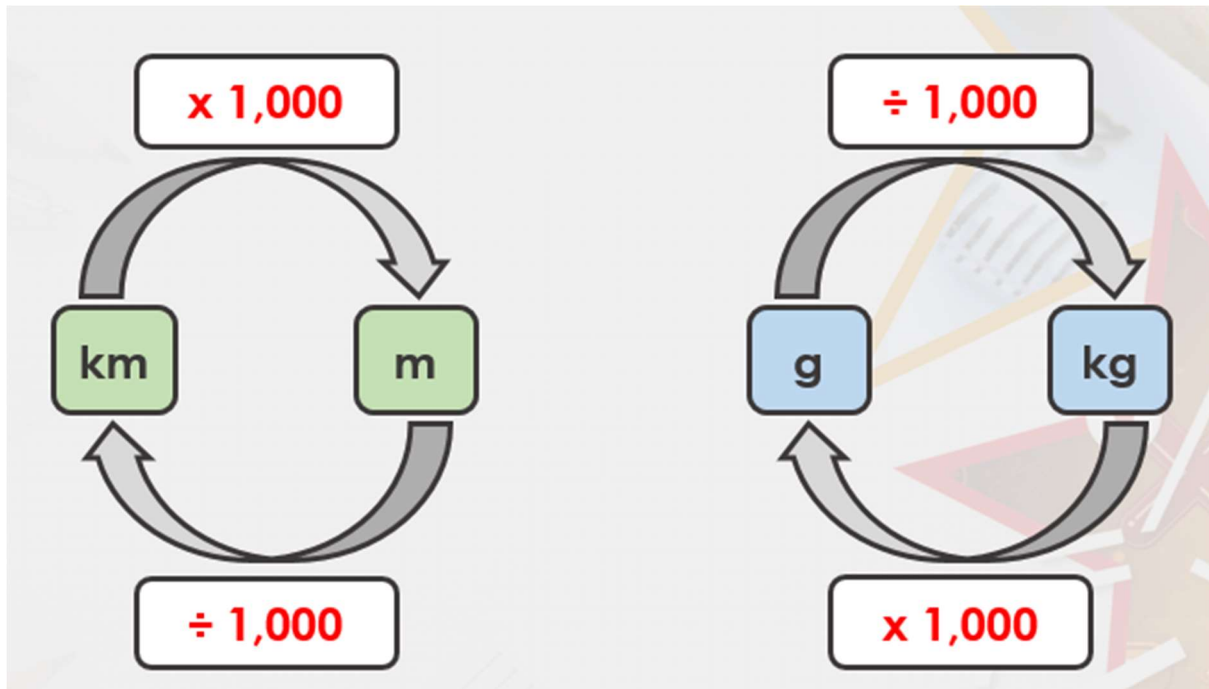
Maths is easier when you smile!



Remember to move the digits and keep the decimal still.



Think – Beyoncé...multiply to the left, divide to the right.



10 millimetres = 1 centimetre

100 centimetres = 1 metre

1000 metres = 1 kilometre



When we have 10 millimetres, it can be called a **centimetre**.

$$1 \text{ centimetre} = 10 \text{ millimetres}$$

A fingernail is about **one centimetre wide**.

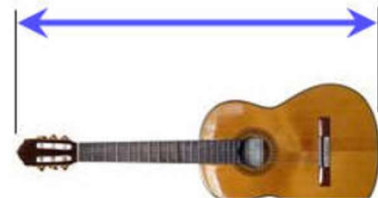


Two tape measures, one in mm, the other in cm

We can use millimetres or centimetres to measure how tall we are, or how wide a table is, but to measure the length of a football field it is better to use **metres**.

A **metre** is equal to 100 centimetres.

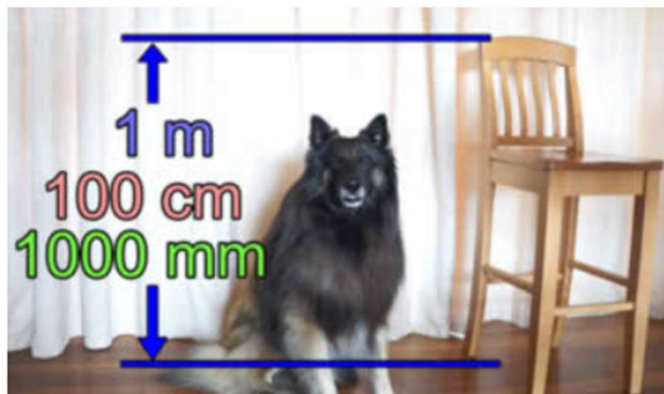
$$1 \text{ metre} = 100 \text{ centimetres}$$



The length of this guitar is about 1 metre

And because a centimetre is 10 millimetres:

$$1 \text{ metre} = 1000 \text{ millimetres}$$



The back of this kitchen chair is 1 metre

## Litre

A **litre** is just a bunch of millilitres put all together. In fact, 1000 millilitres makes up 1 litre:

$$1 \text{ litre} = 1,000 \text{ millilitres}$$

This jug has exactly 1 litre of water in it.



Litres are often written as **L** (for short), so "3 L" means "3 Litres" (some people use lowercase **l**, but that looks too much like **1**).
