


4. Rebus Puzzle

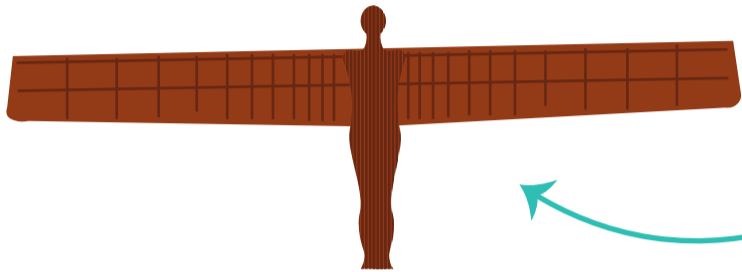

There are lots of famous buildings and statues in England. See if you can name some of them. Ask your parents if you're not sure, or check online.



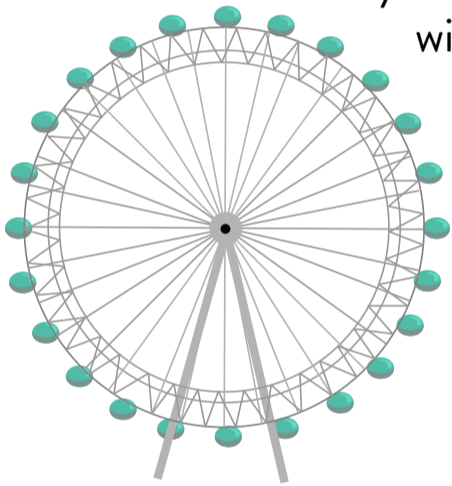
THE ANGEL OF THE _ _ _ _ _

These standing stones were built hundreds of years ago, although no one knows why. Many people think they were built by druids who were wise men from the past.



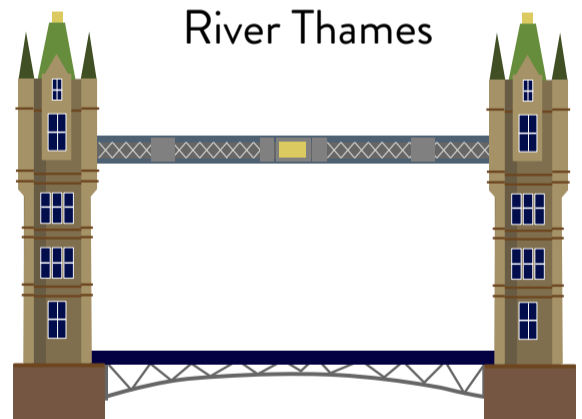

This ferris wheel is huge. It's in the centre of London and from the top you can see almost the whole city.

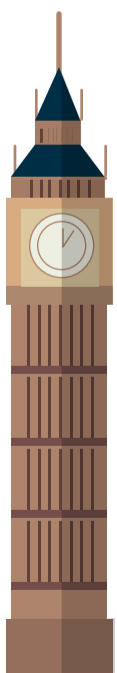

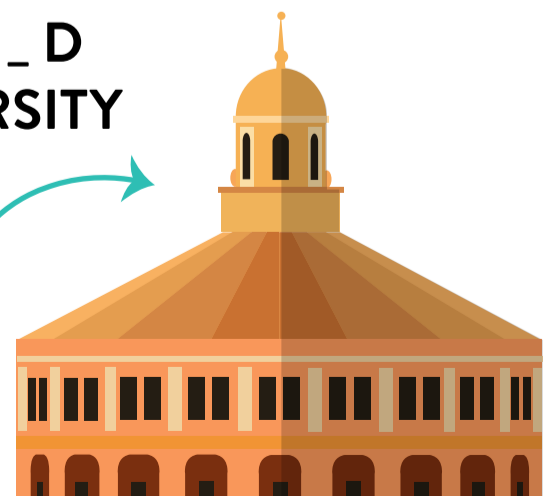

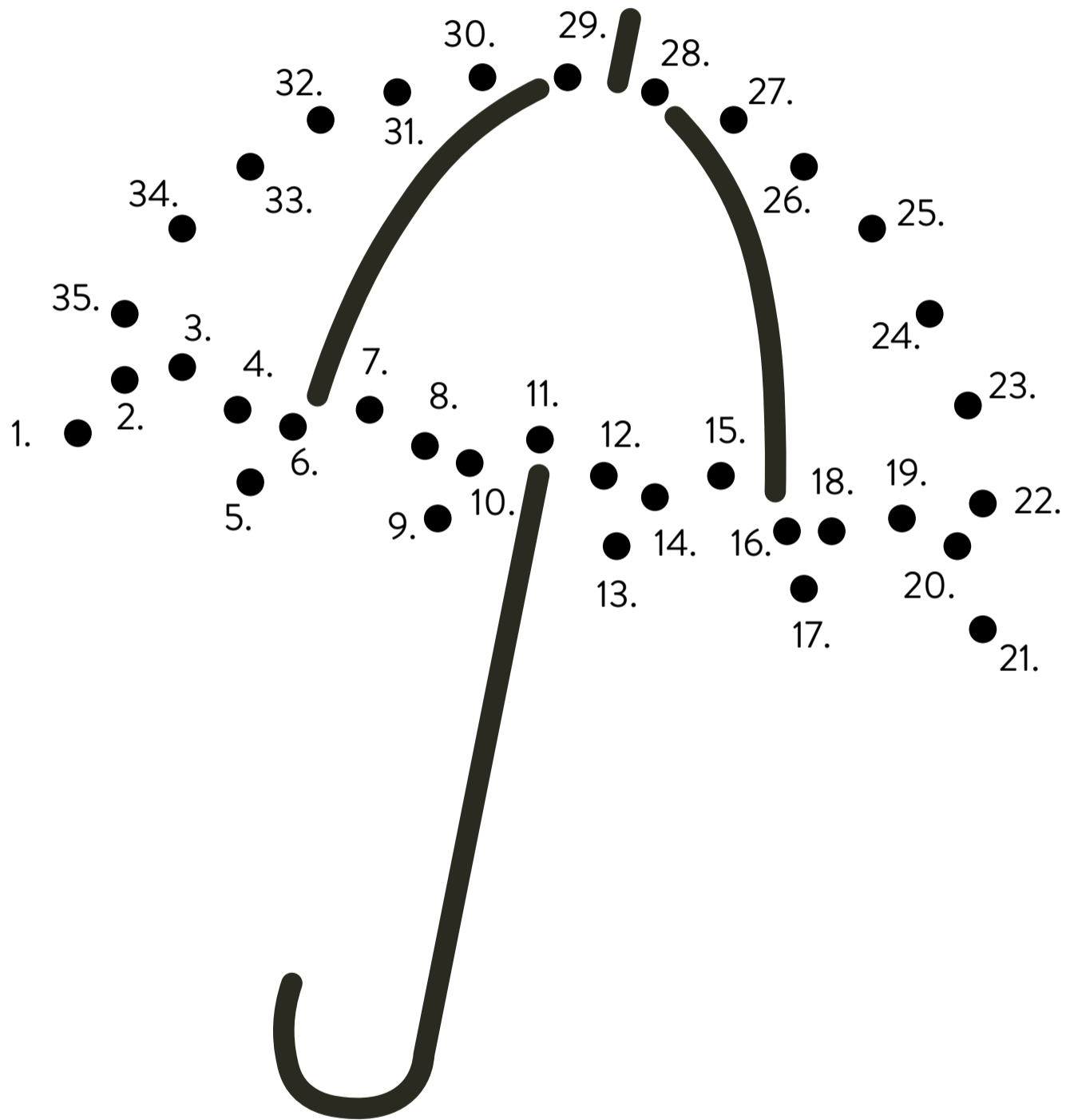
This is a building from one of the oldest universities in the world.
