Capital Letters

- · Listen to the name of each letter.
- Choose a letter and click 'Watch' to see how to write it.
- Air-write the letter as you watch.
- Click 'Try' to trace the letter on your tablet.



- · Find the words on the Word Search.
- · Fill in the form using capital letters.
- Complete 'Add the Capital Letters' worksheet.
- · Complete 'Capitals, Printed, Cursive' sheet.
- · Write all the capital letters on your handwriting paper.
