





	<p>Maths Place Value Addition and Subtraction</p>	<p>Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations. Find 10 or 100 more or less than a given number Recognise the place value of each digit in a three-digit number. Compare and order numbers up to 1000 Read and write numbers up to 1000 in numerals and in words. Count from 0 in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100 Solve number problems and practical problems involving these ideas. Add and subtract numbers mentally, including: a three-digit number and ones; a three-digit number and tens; a three digit number and hundreds. Add and subtract numbers with up to three digits, using formal written methods of columnar addition and subtraction. Estimate the answer to a calculation and use inverse operations to check answers. Solve problems, including missing number problems, using number facts, place value, and more complex addition and subtraction.</p>

Plan, carry out and evaluate experiments to compare rocks.</p> <p>Identify magnetic materials and explore how magnetic forces work. Explore which forces need contact between two objects. Investigate and evaluate products with lever and linkage systems.</p>	<p>Investigate how Bronze changed life lived in the Bronze Age. Investigate how Iron changed life lived in the Iron Age.
