Physical Development

Gross Motor Skills :

- *Ball skills—throwing, catching, kicking
- *Sports day activities—throwing javelin
- *Climbing frame for shoulder muscles

Fine Motor Skills :

- *Scissor skills—irregular shapes
- *Tripod grip in pencil control
- *Weaving in art activities
- *Various sized droppers, tweezers for challenges

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Building Relationships:

- *Work and play cooperatively with others
- *Discuss and demonstrate how to be a good friend

Self Regulation :

- *Discuss feelings and how to wait for something they want
- *Talk about planning to reach a goal

Managing Self :

- *Demonstrate confidence when trying new activities and meeting new people
- *Explain the reasons for class rules/expectations
- *Understand the need for rules by a road and how to follow them

Communication and Language

Listening, attention and understanding :

- *Listen to others with greater concentration
- *Demonstrate understanding of the rules around roads and staying safe
- *Pay attention to different adults as they listen to them

Expressive Arts and Design

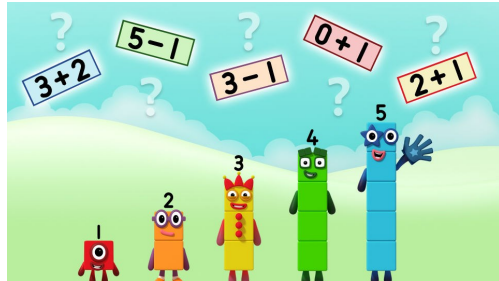
Creating with materials:

We will learning how to write number sentences, using the +, -, = signs correctly



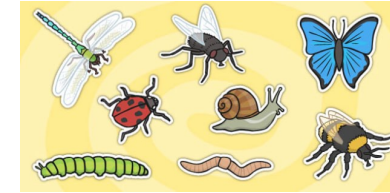
Reception— Exploring Our World
